




Bragging Rights

An Elite Core – Did you know?

- Of more than 16,000 business schools worldwide, only about 5 percent are accredited by AACSB International.
- Most B-school rankings start with AACSB-accredited schools, yet typically only 25 percent of those schools make the final rankings.
